At least for plants. This past growing season proved to be one of the very best in many years. A warm summer with ample rainfall throughout provided our trees, shrubs, flowers and lawns with the perfect recipe to thrive. Plantings remained lush all season and our continued wet fall is providing enough moisture naturally without manually watering. It is important to remember that any new plantings still need to be watered right up until the ground freezes. Another recommendation is to spray newly planted evergreens, rhododendrons, azaleas, etc. with an anti-desiccant. This helps lock in the moisture and reduce drying or sun scald from our dry winter winds. These precautions, in addition to proper mulching will ensure your valuable plantings survive the harsh winter weather.

Hints.....

Like a broken record, TIPS will continue to remind you over & over of a few things to make your winter a little more safe and enjoyable.

- Remember to unhook your hoses from outside faucets to prevent freezing and breaking inside pipes.
- Check your dryer vents. To prevent overheating and chance of fire you need to periodically check your dryer vent and examine the area around dryer motor for lint buildup.
- Inspect your chimney and/or furnace vents. Birds nests, bee hives and any other obstruction may cause your chimney to be plugged creating a possible fire/smoke hazard.
- Finally.....start up that generator! Just like people, the periodic exercising on a warm, bright day may very well save you on that cold, dark night. This peace of mind will pay dividends many times over in the event of another lengthy power outage.
